

BurgerFi makes big debut in Altamonte Springs

You may have heard the saying "go big or go home." And BurgerFi knows its meaning, as everything about the chain's new location in Altamonte Springs is big.

Not only is it the largest BurgerFi location at 4,160 square feet, its debut packed a big punch too, complete with big crowds and big wheels. Even the eatery's ceiling fans are big.

Windermere-based franchisee Adino LLC opened the doors May 12 to the restaurant at 1001 N. State Road 434. The better-burger chain took over the former People's Bank building in the Oak Grove Shoppes plaza in front of The Fresh Market.



The franchisee spent about \$1.6 million to transform the former bank into the burger joint, as previously reported by Orlando Business Journal. The eatery boasts a large outdoor patio, a private room for events and the bank's former vault was turned into storage space for the restaurant's dry goods.

BurgerFi's VIP event on May 10 had a big turnout, complete with long lines, big crowds and a large BurgerFi semi-truck parked outside the restaurant. Get an inside look at the restaurant in the slideshow.

In addition to the big debut of Adino's second BurgerFi eatery, the franchise has big plans in the works for the burger chain. Adino plans to open a BurgerFi location in Clermont later this year, as well as two in Osceola County next year and one in the Winter Springs/Oviedo area in 2016, as previously reported by Orlando Business Journal.
