Orlando clinical trial tests vaccine in teens

Development considered critical for herd immunity

When Dr. Salma Elfaki signed on to lead Moderna's only COVID vaccine trial for teens in Florida, the Lake Nona pediatrician thought she might have trouble finding kids - or parents - willing to participate.

The concern didn't last long. "Even before the news really got out, over 400 patients enlisted," she said. "It has been surreal."

Recruits first emerged from the fami-

lies of fellow physicians and other health professionals who understood the ravages of the virus and the vaccine's development. Then came middle- and high-school devotees of science and technology.

Some wanted to help society reclaim a sense of normalcy. Others were kids with health problems that made them more vulnerable to COVID-19 complications. And still others were from Black and Hispanic families who sought to ensure racial equity.

"Different people had different reasons, but they all were excited to become sort
