- 1. <u>Gallery CERO</u> is now open, on the second floor above Wekiva Island's bar and general store.
- 2. The fine art gallery features local rock stars like Peter Pettegrew. He digs his watercolors and can literally paint the unfathomable in front of you, in one sitting. "I grew up in Northern California and when I moved



to Florida, I was just completely blown away and inspired by Florida landscapes."



- 3. CERO is all about the sustainability vibe. Nina Chatham is the gallerist. About the Wekiva Island owner, Bill, "His dream has c ome to fruition," she said. "The art will always have an environmental tie."
- 4. Pettegrew's sentiments are right on par. "A lot of the places I've painted throughout the years, it's hard to get back into some of these areas, whereas here [at Wekiva Island], you can just go down there right now, get a canoe, go a couple hundred yards away, and you're in complete wilderness."
- 5. The art inside Gallery CERO will change up often. The space is also for special events, art classes and artist demos.
